The average cash withdrawal for April was R423. This is the third-highest value on record. Historically, the index has shown April to have the second- largest spike in a calendar year, after December. It coincides with a number of public holidays, which consumers use to go on vacation.

The 4,8% increase compared with March, and 3,6% increase from April 2010 confirms the rising trend in consumer confidence, even though it has not been adjusted for inflation.

However, the post-holiday May and June index could be a better indication of the health of the economy, but rising inflation, and in particular higher fuel and electricity prices, could hamper consumer confidence.
